Jamaica Library Service Launches National Reading Competition 2016

Jamaica Library Service, an Agency of the Ministry of Education, Youth and Information has recently launched the 29th season of its flagship programme, the National Reading Competition (NRC).

The main objectives of the programme are; to encourage the reading habit, develop reading skills, and cultivate an appreciation of various genres of literature. The first stage is held at individual libraries where competitors vie for the opportunity to compete at the parish level. Thereafter, a Parish Champion is selected for each of the five (5) age groups ranging from 6 to 8, 9 to 11, 12 to 14, 15 to 20 and 21 years and over. The final leg begins in mid-July and culminates with the National Reading Competition Quiz Finals scheduled for August 25, 2016 with a delayed broadcast on Television Jamaica Limited (TVJ).
