The Jamaica Library Service Global Libraries project entitled: 'JLS: Using Technology to Empower Individuals and Communities for Development', was officially launched during library week on Thursday, November 6, 2014 in the Joyce Robinson Hall at the Kingston & St. Andrew Parish Library.

The Minister of Education the Honourable Reverend Ronald Thwaites delivered the main address and declared the project officially launched. In his keynote presentation the Honourable Minister challenged the JLS to be a facilitator of information to various stakeholder groups in the society, in order to enhance knowledge, technology and development. The Minister pledged the support of the Ministry of Education to enable the JLS to successfully implement the project. In a dramatic PowerPoint presentation and drum roll Minister Thwaites unveiled project and declared it officially launched.
